AN ACT Prohibiting the Digging of Bloodworms and Sandworms on Sunday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4301-A-1, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 4301-A-1 to read as follows:

§ 4301-A-1. Digging on Sunday

It is unlawful to dig or take bloodworms or sandworms from the flats, shores or coastal waters of the State on Sunday.
