STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to a Bounty on Unlicensed Dogs in Area Frequented by Deer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 2901, amended. The first sentence of section 2901 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

There shall be a bounty of \$15 for every bobcat, and every unlicensed dog in areas frequented by deer, which is killed within the State, to be paid by the Treasurer of State to the person killing the same upon compliance with the following conditions.
