SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 927, L.D. 1225, Bill, "AN ACT Establishing a State Tuition Equalization Fund for Maine Students Attending Maine Private Institutions of Higher Education."

Amond said Bill by inserting after section 3 and before the Statement of Fact the following:

Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$50,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974 and \$50,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975 to the Department of Educational and Cultural Services for an average subsidy for Viet Nam Era Neteran Students.

A Thot Nam Era veteran for the purposes of this subsidy shall be construed to mean any person who served in the Armed Forces of the United States on active duty during the Viet Nam Era and who has been discharged on released therefrom under honorable conditions. A veteran of the Viet Nam Era shall have served on active duty for a period of more than 380 days, any part of which occurred after August 4, 1964, except if he was discharged for a service-connected disability after such date.

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide for an appropriation for educational subsidy to Viet Nam veterans who are students.
