STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Residency Requirement to be Candidate for Office in Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 22, § 4793, additional. Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 4793 to read as follows:

§ 4793. Residency for candidates

A candidate for any elective office in the Penobscot Tribe of Indians must have been a resident of the Penobscot Reservation for at least 30 days.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require a 30-day residency requirement before running for a Penobscot Tribe of Indians' office.
