**AN ACT** Relating to Residency Requirement to be Candidate for Office in  
Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 22, § 4793, additional.** Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 4793 to read as follows:

**§ 4793. Residency for candidates**

**A candidate for any elective office in the Penobscot Tribe of Indians must have been a resident of the Penobscot Reservation for at least 30 days.**

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require a 30-day residency requirement before running for a Penobscot Tribe of Indians' office.
