AN ACT Relating to Seasonal Employment under the Employment Security Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 1251, sub-§ 3, additional. Title 26 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 3 to read as follows:

3. Exception. Any hotel, motel, inn, sporting camp or other lodging facility, including camps operated for boys and girls, restaurants and other eating establishments which customarily suspends its operations which are primarily related to the production of its characteristic goods or services for a regularly recurring period or periods up to 180 days in any one year shall be deemed seasonal by nature and shall not be subject to regulation by the commission and shall be exempt from the Employment Security Law.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide by law rather than by regulation of the commission exemption under the Employment Security Law for seasonal food and lodging establishments.
