AN ACT Permitting Restaurants to Sell Malt Liquor not to be Consumed on the Premises.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 28, § 701, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 701 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

Population shall be determined according to each Federal Decennial Census as shown by any official report authorized by the Federal Census Act and shall apply to the licensing period next following such official report.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 28, § 801, amended. The last sentence of section 801 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

No licensee for the sale of liquor to be consumed on the premises where sold shall by himself, clerk, servant or agent sell, give, furnish or deliver any liquor to be consumed elsewhere than upon the licensed premises, except, subject to the provisions of law and the rules and regulations of the commission, hotel licensees may sell liquor in the original packages to bona fide registered room guests and restaurant and Class-A restaurant licensees may sell malt liquor in the original packages to be consumed elsewhere than upon the licensed premises.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is reflected in the title and will bring in additional revenue to the State.
