STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Prohibiting Law Enforcement Officers from Purchasing or Consuming Liquor While on Duty.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 10, additional. Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 10, to read as follows:

§ 10. Law enforcement officers purchasing liquor while on duty

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, no law enforcement officer while on duty, nor in the performance of his duties, shall purchase, nor cause to be purchased, liquor in any form for either immediate consumption or for any other use, nor shall he consume liquor of any kind, nature or description while on duty. Any law enforcement officer, while on duty, who violates this section shall be immediately suspended from duty without pay and, if found guilty, shall be dismissed from his job.
