AN ACT Relating to Duties of Officers who Enforce the Liquor Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 55, sub-§ 14, amended. Subsection 14 of section 55 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

Any enforcement officer, while on duty, and working for and under the Department of Public Safety and assigned to the enforcement division of the State Liquor Commission, shall immediately identify himself upon entering licensed premises to the owner, his clerk, agent or servant and state his reason for being on the licensed premises.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to keep enforcement officers out of uniform and to stop undue harassment of licensees.
