**AN ACT Providing Free Licenses for Passamaquoddy Indians to Dig Clams
on Reservation Lands.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4302-C, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 4302-C to read as follows:

§ 4302-C. Licenses for Passamaquoddy Indians

The Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries shall issue a license to dig or take clams on the Passamaquoddy reservation lands to any Indian of the Passamaquoddy Tribe without any charge or fee, providing the Indian presents a certificate from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs stating that the person described is an Indian and a member of that tribe.
