## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 106TH LEGISLATURE

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1025, L.D. 1347, Bill,
"AN ACT to Exempt House Parents at Boys Training Center from
Law Dealing with Housing and Food Supplies Furnished by State
Departments."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following emergency preamble:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, under existing law house parents are required to pay for housing and food supplies furnished by the Boys Training Center at South Portland; and

Whereas, house parents are required as a part of their job to spend long hours at the Boys Training Center and to eat all their meals with the boys; and

Whereas, paying for quarters occupied and food eaten has created a hardship for these house parents currently employed and will make it difficult to hire other houseparents should vacancies occur; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, now, therefore, '

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the end before

the statement of fact, the following:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

The purpose of this amendment is to provide for an emergency preamble and clause.
