HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1068, L. D. 1393, Bill, "AN ACT Exempting Fuels Used to Heat Commercial Broiler Houses from the Sales Tax."

Amend said Bill in the Title by striking out the word "Broiler" and inserting in place thereof the word 'Poultry'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the last paragraph before the Statement of Fact and inserting in place thereof the following:

'9-B. Heating poultry houses. Coal, oil, wood and all other fuels, when bought for heating buildings in which chickens are commercially raised, commonly used for housing poultry.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to substitute the word "poultry" for the word "broiler" which will provide greater equality under the law.
