## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

## AN ACT Exempting Fuels Used to Heat Commercial Broiler Houses from the Sales Tax.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 36, § 1760, sub-§ 9-B, additional. Section 1760 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection 9-B to read as follows:
- 9-B. Heating broiler houses. Coal, oil, wood and all other fuels, when bought for heating buildings in which chickens are commercially raised, commonly called "broiler houses."

#### FISCAL NOTE

It is estimated that for a full year the loss of revenue would approximately be \$50,000.
