**AN ACT Exempting Fuels Used to Heat Commercial
Broiler Houses from the Sales Tax.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 36, § 1760, sub-§ 9-B, additional. Section 1760 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection 9-B to read as follows:

9-B. Heating broiler houses. Coal, oil, wood and all other fuels, when bought for heating buildings in which chickens are commercially raised, commonly called "broiler houses."

FISCAL NOTE

It is estimated that for a full year the loss of revenue would approximately be \$50,000.
