**AN ACT Providing for Overtime Pay of State Police and Municipal Police
Officers.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 25, § 1504-A, additional. Title 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1504-A, to read as follows:

§ 1504-A. Overtime

A member of the State Police shall be paid at the rate of $1\frac{1}{2}$ times his regular compensation when he has worked over 40 hours in any work-week.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 2405, additional. Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2405, to read as follows:

§ 2405. Overtime

A municipal police officer shall be paid at the rate of $1\frac{1}{2}$ times his regular compensation when he has worked over 40 hours in any work-week.

Sec. 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$214,995 and from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$645,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974, and from the General Fund the sum of \$286,662 and from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$859,982 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975, to carry out the purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this law, if enacted, will be to adequately pay State Troopers, City Policemen and other police enforcements involved in patrolling roads, maintaining order and for other purposes during the long holiday weekends, when extra time is needed and more officers are required on the highways.
