COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1164, L. D. 1499, Bill, "AN ACT Increasing Minimum Wages and Providing for Overtime."

Amend said Bill in the title by striking out the words "Increasing Minimum Wages and"

Further amend said Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the Statement of Fact and inserting in place thereof the following:

'<u>R. S., T. 26, § 664, amended.</u> The first sentence of section 664 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 88 of chapter 622 of the public laws of 1971, is amended to read as follows:

By reason of the declaration of policy set forth in section 661 and in the protection of the industry or business and in the enhancement of public interest, health, safety and welfare, it is declared unlawful for any employer to employ any employee except as otherwise provided in this subchapter at the rate of less than \$1.80 per hour; nor work more than 40 hours in one week, unless 1 1/2 times the regular hourly rate is paid for all work done over 40 hours <u>but no</u> <u>more than 50 hours</u> in any one week <u>and unless 2 times the regular</u> <u>hourly rate is paid for all work done over 50 hours in any one week;</u> and whenever the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess of \$1.80 per hour, the minimum wage established under this section shall be increase to the same amount, effective either on the same date as the increase in the highest federal minimum wage or September 23, 1971, whichever occurs later, but in no case shall the minimum wage exceed \$2 per hour.'

Statement of Fact (Tiling No. #-394)

The purpose of this amendment is to delete from the provisions of the bill the area relating to minimum wages.
