AN ACT Relating to Agreements under **Minimum Wage Law.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 663, sub-§ 3-A, additional. Section 663 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection 3-A to read as follows:

3-A. Application. The exemptions enumerated in this section shall only apply if the employee has agreed in writing thereto prior to the employment for which wages are to be paid, except that employees enumerated in subsection 3, paragraphs A, C, D, G, H, I and J do not have to sign such agreements and their employers are exempt from the requirement of this subsection. Employees enumerated in subsection 3, paragraphs B, E and F must agree in writing to accept less than the minimum wage, unless they are covered by other exempt classifications as well.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that certain persons exempt from the minimum wage must agree in writing in order to be exempt or work for less than the minimum wage.
