STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Exempting Electricity for Cooking and Heating in Homes from Sales Tax.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 36, § 1760, sub-§ 9, amended. Subsection 9 of section 1760 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- g. Coal, oil and wood. Coal, oil, wood and all other fuels, except gas and electricity, as otherwise provided, when bought for cooking and heating in homes, hotels and apartment houses, and other buildings designed both for human habitation and sleeping; and electricity when bought for cooking and heating in homes and apartment houses.

FISCAL NOTE

It is estimated that this bill would result in a loss of sales tax revenue amounting to \$2,150,000 for a full 12-month year.
