**AN ACT Consolidating the Maine Industrial Building Authority, the Maine Municipal Securities Approval Board and the Maine Recreation Authority under the Department of Commerce and Industry.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 10, § 8101, amended. Section 8101 of Title 10 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 481 and as amended by the public laws of 1971, is further amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

The Department of Commerce and Industry shall further include the Maine Industrial Building Authority, the Maine Municipal Securities Approval Board and the Maine Recreation Authority.

**STATEMENT OF FACT**

The purpose of this bill will consolidate the staff resources of the Maine Industrial Building Authority, the Maine Municipal Securities Approval Board and the Maine Recreation Authority thereby improving their effectiveness as well as increasing and facilitating their coordination and communication with the Maine Department of Commerce and Industry.

This bill, while strengthening their administrative functions and capabilities, will in no way alter either the responsibilities of the staffs to their respective approval boards or the independence of these boards.
