STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Permitting Liquor Licensed Clubs to Sell Tickets to its Members and Guests for Prizes to Raise Funds for Club Purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T 28, § 305, amended. The last paragraph of section 305 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 372 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a licensed club from offering prizes, gratuities or other inducements, otherwise legal, as a means of promoting attendance on licensed premises or raising funds for club purposes. In offering such prizes, a licensed club may sell tickets to its members and guests.
