STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Creating a Homestead Tax Exemption for Totally Disabled Veterans who are Residents of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 36, § 656, sub-§ 1, ¶ H, additional. Subsection 1 of section 656 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new paragraph H, to read as follows:
 - H. The first \$10,000 of value of the estates of all Maine residents who shall be totally disabled from any gainful employment and who shall be so certified by at least 2 medical doctors, and who shall have served in the Armed Forces of the United States for any period of time and have been separated therefrom under other than dishonorable conditions when said said estates are in actual use by such person as homesteads. The exemption provided in this paragraph shall apply to the property of such resident including property held in joint tenancy with his or her spouse.
