AN ACT Relating to Planning Function of the Maine Law
Enforcement Planning and Assistance Agency.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 5, § 3350, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 3350 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 465 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

The agency is to have those powers necessary to be designated as the "State Planning Agency" within the meaning of Title 1 of Public Law 90-351, the "Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968," and Public Law 90-445, the "Juvenile Delinquency Prevention and Control Act of 1968," and the "Law Enforcement Revenue Sharing Act of 1973."

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow the Maine Law Enforcement Planning and Assistance Agency to continue to be the designated planning agency for comprehensive criminal justice plans within the State of Maine under the Law Enforcement Revenue Sharing Act of 1973 if it is passed by Congress and signed by the President of the United States. If this Act does come into law, it will replace the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 that is presently now in effect.
