STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Require Fees for Motor Vehicle Inspection Mechanic's Examination.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 2124, amended. Section 2124 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

The Chief of the State Police shall receive a fee of \$1 with each application requesting examination for the purpose of qualifying for a motor vehicle inspection mechanic's certificate. Such fee shall not be required when an examination is ordered by an officer of the State Police or by the Administrative Hearing Commissioner.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make applicants more sincere in their desire to qualify for this certificate and to eliminate the large number who will not properly prepare as the test currently is free and can be taken as often as the individual desires.
