STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Regulate Settlements of Total Loss under the Maine Insurance Code.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 24-A, § 2414, sub-§ 1, ¶ C, additional. Subsection I of section 2414 of Title 24-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section I of chapter 132 of the public laws of 1969, is amended by adding a new paragraph C to read as follows:
 - C. If it contains provisions or other indications which prohibit or rerestrict settlement of any severable portion of a total loss until the entire claim is settled.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this bill is to prevent insurers from withholding settlement of a total loss, such as the case of a motor vehicle or home until a settlement of personal injury or personal property can be reached. Such areas are severable and settlement should be allowed on that basis for each portion.
