HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1440, L. D. 1810, Bill, "AN ACT Designating a Commemorative Day in Remembrance of Martin Luther King, Jr."

Amend said Bill by inserting at the beginning of the first line after the enacting clause the underlined abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 1.' and by striking out in the 5th line the underlined word "may" and inserting in place thereof the underlined word 'shall'

Further amend said Bill by inserting at the end, before the Statement of Fact, the following:

'Sec. 2. R. S., T. 20, §1233, additional. Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1233 to read as follows:

§1233. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day

January 15th of each year shall be designated as Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and public schools in this State are encouraged to set aside a portion of the school day to enlighten and inform the youth of Maine of the life of Martin Luther King, Jr.'

The purpose of this amendment is to provide for Martin Luther King, Jr. Day in the public schools.
