SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to H. P. 1446, L. D. 1866, Bill,
"AN ACT Relating to Lead Poisoning Control."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 1320." by adding at the end the following: 'Such inspections shall be made only where there are resonable grounds to believe that there are lead base substances in or upon the exposed surfaces of any dwelling or dwelling unit.'

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 1321." in the 4th line from the end (same in L.D.) by inserting after the underlined word "removed" the underlined words 'by the owner'

Further amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 1322." in the 10th line (9th line in L.D.) by inserting after the underlined word "evicted" the underlined words 'for that reason'

Statement of Fact

It is the purpose of this amendment to limit inspections to dwellings where there are reasonable grounds to suspect that there is a lead base problem, to limit responsibility for removing notice to landlord and to clarify the bill.
