SENATE AMENDMENT " C " to S. P. 642, L. D. 1977, Bill, "AN ACT
Creating a Study Commission on Environmental Laws."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the first paragraph
after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 1. Study Commission on Environmental Laws; created.

A Study Commission on Environmental Laws shall be created, consisting
of 20 members, including the Commissioner of Environmental Protection;
6 members appointed by the Governor, who shall include representatives
of municipal government, industry, labor, conservation, real estate
and law; and the 13 members of the Joint Legislative Committee on
Natural Resources.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment would allow one of the gubernatorial appointees
to be a representative of municipal government. Since municipalities
administer many of the environmental statutes, it is felt that they
should be represented on the study committee.
