IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Salaries of Jury Commissioners and County Officers in the Several Counties of the State and Court Messenger of Cumberland County and Payments to the County Law Libraries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 4, § 113, amended. Section 113 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

§ 113 Messenger of Cumberland County

The superior court messenger of Cumberland County shall be appointed by the senior resident Superior Court Justice and shall receive an annual salary of $\frac{7}{200}$ \$7,560 in full compensation for service and attendance.

Sec. 4. R. S., T. 27, § 224, amended. The 2nd to the 17th paragraphs of section 224 of Title 27 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by chapter 255 of the public laws of 1971, are repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
