AN ACT Making Supplemental Appropriations from the General Fund for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1974.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of departments and institutions will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1973; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Appropriations from General Fund. In order to provide for necessary expenditures of government and other purposes for the fiscal year — from July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974 — the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulations, are appropriated out of any moneys in the General Fund not otherwise appropriated.

Sec. 3. Resolves, 1971, c. 23, amended. The last pargraph of chapter 23 of the resolves of 1971 is amended by adding at the end the following new sentence:

Any balance remaining shall not lapse but shall carry forward until June 30, 1975.

Sec. 4. P. & S. L., 1971, c. 179, Section C, amended. That part of Section C of chapter 179 of the private and special laws of 1971 under the caption "ADJUTANT GENERAL" which relates to Phase III — Intrusion Detection System, is amended by adding at the end the following new sentence:

This appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a carrying account until June 30, 1975.

- Sec. 24. P. & S. L., 1971, c. 179, Section C, amended. The last paragraph under the caption "VETERANS SERVICES" of Section C of chapter 179 of the private and special laws of 1971 is amended by adding a new sentence to read as follows:

All unexpended balances of the funds provided for land purchase shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1975.
