SENATE AMENDMENT" I" to S. P. 678, L.D. 2044, Bill, "AN ACT to Correct Errors and Inconsistencies in the Public Laws."

Amend said Bill by inserting after section 126 the following:

'Sec. 126-A. R.S., T. 22, §4831, amended. Section 4831 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by chapter 104 of the public laws of 1973, is amended by adding after the first paragraph the following new paragraph:

Whenever the offices of Tribal Governor and lieutenant governor at Pleasant Point are vacant at the same time or whenever both governor and lieutenant governor are unable to discharge the duties of their offices the tribal council at Pleasant Point Reservation shall, at a meeting called by the chairman of the council for that purpose, designate who shall act as governor until such vacancy is filled or such disability ceases.

Sec. 126-B. R.S., T. 22, §4831, amended. The 2nd sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 4831 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by chapter 104 of the public laws of 1973, is amended to read as follows:

In the absence of the governor, the lieutenant governor shall preside and the council of each reservation may choose, at its own discretion, a chairman who shall have such duties as may be assigned to him.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to provide that if the office of governor and lieutenant governor are vacant at the same time, provision is made for a governor and to provide for a tribal council chairman.
