**RESOLVE, Permitting the County of Kennebec to Expend Money for  
Public Ambulance Service.**

---

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the present law permits municipalities to raise money to provide for public ambulance service; and

Whereas, there are many small municipalities in Kennebec County which are unable to provide funds for such a service, these services now being provided by the county; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to permit the county commissioners of Kennebec County to raise money to continue such services for the benefit and well-being of the citizens in the several municipalities; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

**Ambulance service; Kennebec County. Resolved:** That the county commissioners of Kennebec County are authorized to expend county funds for the operation of a public ambulance service.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
