STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FOUR

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Lauren Sturtevant of South Paris for Damage to Property by Escapee from Boys Training Center.

Lauren Sturtevant; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$351.99 to be paid to Lauren Sturtevant of South Paris as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for destruction of property by an escapee from the Boys Training Center.

STATEMENT OF FACT

In June 1971, his car was stolen from the yard of the Lauren Sturtevant home and was later discovered by a deputy sheriff over 30 miles away in Roxbury at an old discontinued road where the car had been driven and rammed through a growth of trees as far as possible. An escapee from the Boys Training Center was found responsible. Towing charges and repairs make up the claim.
