### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR

AN ACT Relating to Eligibility for Employment in the State's Classified Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 5, § 673, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 673 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

The director shall determine the character, type and content of examination for admission to the classified service; the time and place for holding examinations; the form of application blanks for admission to the examination to be filed by applicants; the minimum requirements for admission to the examination and the value of each phase of the tests used in determining the average rating of the applicant.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill clarifies the authority of the Director of Personnel relative to civil service examinations and deletes the residency requirement from this section, replacing it in a more appropriate section of the law.
