STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR

AN ACT Relating to Definition of Public Place as to Drinking Alcoholic Beverages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 2003, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 2003 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new sentence at the end to read as follows:

Except that, for the purposes of this section, any dance event sponsored by, or for the sole benefit of, any hospital association, religious association, firemen's association or policemen's association shall not constitute a public place.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit patrons to bring their own liquor to fund raising dances conducted for the benefit of the foregoing charitable organizations.
