**AN ACT to Permit Hours of Sale of Liquor in Take-out Stores to  
Correspond with On-premises Establishments.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 28, § 4, amended.** The first sentence of section 4 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended to read as follow:

No liquor shall be sold in this State on Sundays except as hereinafter provided, and no licensee by himself, clerk, servant or agent shall, between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m., sell or deliver any liquors, except no liquors shall be sold or delivered on Saturdays after 11:45 p.m. and except that in class A restaurants, taverns, class A taverns, **retail stores**, hotels and clubs liquor may, except as provided, be sold to 1 a.m.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this legislation to prevent discrimination against one segment of the industry.
