AN ACT to Establish a Daily Limit on Salmon.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 3951, sub-§ 2-B, additional. Section 3951 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 264 of the public laws of 1969, is further amended by adding a new section 2-B to read as follows:

2-B. Daily limit. Except as provided in subsection 2, no one shall take more than 2 salmon in any one day.
