Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Glidden; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$503.38 to be paid to Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Glidden of Gardiner as a full and final settlement of their claim against the State for damages to their property caused by 2 state wards.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

On June 9, 1973 2 state wards entered and vandalized the home of Mr. and Mrs. Glidden in Gardiner. Considerable damage to the contents of the home was caused. The damage has been partially reimbursed by the State.
