**AN ACT to Regulate Procedures for Obtaining Short-term Permits for
Farm Motor Trucks.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 246, amended. The first sentence of the last paragraph of section 246 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 362 of the public laws of 1969, is further amended to read as follows:

When a truck is already registered, the owner, by paying an additional fee at any troop barracks of the Maine State Police, may receive a short-term permit allowing him to haul loads of larger tonnage for a limited period of 8 months or less.

STATEMENT OF FACT

It is the intent of this Act to restore a policy of being able to obtain booster licenses for trucks at the State Police barracks throughout the State. The present policy of applying by mail is inconvenient and is causing hardship for those who do not anticipate the need or are required to travel great distances to obtain such permits.
