STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-FOUR

AN ACT to Prohibit Executive Sessions in Public Proceedings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 1, § 404, repealed and replaced. Section 404 of Title 1 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 404. Executive sessions

Such executive sessions shall only be allowed in personnel matters upon a majority vote of the members of the Committees of the Maine Legislature, the administrative or legislative body of the State, or of any of its counties or municipalities, or of any other political subdivision of the State, which body is composed of 3 or more members.
