STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR

AN ACT Making Supplemental Appropriations from the General Fund and Allocating Money from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1975.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of departments and institutions will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1974; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

GENERAL FUND

APPROPRIATIONS FROM GENERAL FUND

Sec. 1. Appropriations from General Fund. In order to provide for necessary expenditures of government and other purposes for the fiscal year—

July 1, 1974 to June 30, 1975—the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulations, are appropriated out of any moneys in the General Fund not otherwise appropriated.

FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING FUND SUBSIDIES TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS

Sec. 2. Supplemental Allocation of Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. Additional income to the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for the current Fiscal Year 1974 and the next Fiscal Year 1975 shall be segregated, apportioned and expended as follows:

EDUCATION—SUBSIDIES TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS

1974-75

Foundation Program—Equalization

\$2,469,663

This allocates additional revenue sharing and investment income available in the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund subject to provisions set forth in Sections 2 through 6 of Chapter 98 of the Private and Special Laws of 1973.

GENERAL FUND

SUBSIDIES TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS

Sec. 3. P. L., 1973, c. 556, § 16, amended. Section 16 of chapter 556 of the public laws of 1973 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 16. Appropriation. There is appropriated to the Department of Educational and Cultural Services the sum of \$\$9,512,778 \$87,043,115 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975, to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This amendment decreases the appropriation from the General Fund for equalizing the financial support of school units by the same amount that is included in the supplemental allocation of Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1974.
