STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR

AN ACT Relating to Damages for Violating the Bulldozing of Rivers, Streams and Brooks Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2205, amended. Section 2205 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as last repealed and replaced by section 36 of chapter 622 of the public laws of 1971, is amended by adding after the first sentence, a new sentence to read as follows:

The commissioner, upon receiving written notice of the final disposition, may require restoration from the person convicted under this section of the affected area to its condition prior to the occurrence of the violation.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This change would permit the commissioner to require damages to be corrected if he deems feasible.
