COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " B" to S. P. 826, L. D.
2353, Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify Certain Administrative
Aspects of the Saco River Corridor Commission."

Amend said Bill in section 1 in the 11th
line (10th line in L. D.) by inserting after
the stricken out figures "~~1936~~" the underlined
words 'at any time during'

Further amend said Bill in section 7 in that
part designated "Sec. 22." by striking out all
of the last underlined sentence and inserting
in place thereof the following: 'Notwithstanding
any provision of law to the contrary, the
commission may promulgate air or water quality
standards which are more stringent than those
promulgated by the Department of Environmental
Protection.'

Further amend said Bill in section 7 in that
part designated "Sec. 32." by striking out all
of the last underlined paragraph and inserting in
place thereof the following:

'The commission may retain private counsel
for the conduct of commission meetings, hearings
and advice on other legal matters.'

Statement of Fact

This / is designed to clarify certain
administrative aspects of the Saco River Corridor
Commission relating to the conduct of hearings
and the commission's relationship with the Attorney
General, to permit a 60-day extension of the
deadline for zoning the land within the Saco
River Corridor, to correct other errors and
omissions in the original legislation and further
provides that the Saco River Corridor Commission
is a body corporate and politic.
