COMMITTEE AMENDMENT" A" to S.P. 828, L.D. 2362, Bill, "AN ACT to Establish Better Interlocal Cooperation in Preparedness for Civil Disasters and Emergencies."

Amend said Bill by striking out in the first line of that part designated "§ 59." (same in L.D.) the underlined word "defense" and inserting in place thereof the following: 'civil emergency preparedness'

Further amend said Bill by striking out in the 7th and 8th lines (6th and 7th in L.D.) of subsection 4 of that part designated \$59." the following underlined words: "Interstate Civil Emergency Preparedness Compact" and inserting in place thereof the following: Interstate Civil Defense and Disaster Compact'

Further amend said Bill by inserting after subsection 3 of that part designated "§ 59." the following:

'4. Each municipal, inter-jurisdictional or county civil emergency preparedness agency, as part of the development of a disaster emergency plan for the area subject to its jurisdiction, shall consult with hospitals within its jurisdiction to insure that the disaster plans developed by the agencies and the hospitals are compatible.'

Further amend said Bill by renumbering subsections 1 to 7 to be 5 to 8.
