#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FOUR

AN ACT Providing Emergency Funds for Staffing a Fuel Allocation Office Within the Bureau of Civil Defense for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1974.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Fuel Allocation Office will become due and payable before July 1, 1974; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Military, Civil Defense and Veterans' Services, Bureau of Civil Defense, the sum of \$45,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this amendment is to provide funds to continue the Fuel Allocation Office for the balance of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974.
