COMMITTEE AMENDMENT" A "to S.P. 832, L.D. 2375,
"AN ACT Establishing the Office of Energy Resources."

Amend said Bill by inserting after the enacting
clause the following:

'Sec. 1. R.S., T. 2, §6, sub-§6, amended. Sub-
section 6 of section 6 of Title 2 of the Revised
Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 2 of
chapter 509 of the public laws of 1973, is amended
by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

Director of the Office of Energy Resources.'

Further amend said Bill in section 1 by striking
out all of the first paragraph of subsection 2 of that
part designated "§5006." and inserting in place there-
of the following:

2. Membership. The State Energy Resources
Advisory Council shall consist of the following: One
member of the House of Representatives to be
appointed by the Speaker of the House and one member
of the Senate to be appointed by the President of
the Senate, with said legislators to serve ex officio;
the following 10 members who shall serve ex officio:
The Director of the State Planning Office; the Di-
rector of the Bureau of Civil Defense; the Commis-
ioner of Health and Welfare; the Commissioner of Trans-
portation; the Commissioner of Commerce and Industry;
the Commissioner of Conservation; the Commissioner
of Environmental Protection; the Commissioner of

Manpower Affairs; the Chairman of the Public Utilities Commission; the Attorney General, or their designated representatives; and 8 members to be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, such members to be selected on the basis of their interest, education and experience in the areas of energy planning, research and development, to include one representative from the business community, one representative of industry, one representative of labor, 2 representatives from the academic community and 3 representatives of the general public.'

Further amend said Bill by renumbering the sections to read consecutively.

Statement of Fact

The amendment provides for 2 legislators and the Director of the State Planning Office to serve on the Energy Resources Advisory Council; it also sets the maximum salary to be paid the Director of the Office of Energy Resources.
