AN ACT to Eliminate the Position of Assistant Director of the Bureau of Labor and Industry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 41, amended. The 4th and the 6th sentences of section 41 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, are further amended to read as follows:

He shall appoint, subject to the Personnel Law, such employees as may be necessary ~~and a deputy who shall be clerk of the bureau and deputy state factory inspector.~~

The director ~~and deputy state factory inspector~~ shall receive ~~their~~ his actual traveling expenses.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This Act implements Maine Management and Cost Survey recommendation 15 of the Bureau of Labor and Industry. The position of assistant director, who is the clerk of the bureau and deputy state factory inspector, is eliminated with a salary saving of \$12,100. This recommendation was supported by the Governor in his Special Message to the Special Session of the 106th Legislature on January 10, 1974.
