STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Repeal the Law Requiring Payments to Hospitals be Dedicated for Care of Those Qualifying for Aid to the Aged, Blind or Disabled.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1965, c. 503, Sec. 3, repealed and replaced. Section 3 of chapter 503 of the public laws of 1965 is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Sec. 3. Department of Mental Health and Corrections funds. All sums received by the Department of Mental Health and Corrections under section 1 shall be credited to the General Fund.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill implements recommendation #4, Department of Mental Health and Corrections, in the Maine Management and Cost Survey Report. Because enactment of this bill would preclude participation in the grant-in-aid program, the Governor recommended that this bill be given further study in his Special Message to the 106th Legislature on January 10, 1974.
