AN ACT to Authorize a Food Stamp Program in Cumberland County.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, a food stamp program is urgently needed in Cumberland County for the welfare of some citizens; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to implement such a program as of July, 1974; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 416, amended. Section 416 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 571 of the public laws of 1971, is amended by adding at the end the following new sentence:

The county commissioners of Cumberland County shall be authorized to borrow in anticipation of federal revenue sharing funds or budget for the year 1975 an amount not to exceed \$100,000 to operate and administer such a program.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
