STATE OF MAINE

AN ACT Relating to Licensing under the Liquor Law of Managers,
Bartenders, Clerks, Servants or Agents Employed by Licensees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 902-A, additional. Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 902-A to read as follows:

§ 902-A. Managers, bartenders, clerks, etc.

Licensees who are the holders of a state liquor license for on-premise consumption of liquor shall furnish the bureau with the names of all managers, bartenders, clerks, servants or agents employed by them.

Any person employed or performing the duties of a manager, bartender, clerk, servant or agent of a licensee in a premise licensed for the sale of liquors, to be consumed on the premises, shall, prior to employment, obtain a license from the State Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages.

All applicants for license shall be required to file applications in such form as the bureau shall require. The license fee shall be \$10 and shall expire on the applicant's birthdate 2 years from the date of issuance. Licenses may be renewed on payment of \$10.

Licenses issued by the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages shall be subject to all requirements as set forth in sections 401, 402 and 403.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this Bill is reflected in the Title. It is presented as a result of Recommendations Nos. 21 and 22 listed under the Department of Public Safety in the Maine Management and Cost Survey Report. The Governor supported this recommendation in his Special Message to the 106th Legislature presented on January 10, 1974.
