**AN ACT Repealing Legislation Stipulating Departmental Organization of
the Department of Educational and Cultural Services.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 20, § 1-B, repealed. Section 1-B of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 3 of chapter 610 of the public laws of 1971, is repealed.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 20, § 102, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 102 of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 7 of chapter 610 of the public laws of 1971, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

The commissioner is authorized to organize the department into bureaus, divisions and other subdivisions and employ the personnel he deems necessary, subject to the Personnel Law.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of this Act is to remove legislative restrictions on organization of the Department of Educational and Cultural Services and to give the commissioner authority to organize the department and employ personnel he deems necessary, subject to Personnel Law. It is based upon Recommendations 7 and 105, Department of Education and Cultural Services, of Maine Management and Cost Survey Report and was approved by Governor Kenneth M. Curtis in his special message to the 106th Legislature dated January 10, 1974.
